Love Giving and receiving pleasure Help others remember their story Sorrow and delight Bring another to the face of God Missional reciprocal giving Must be willing to bleed, to birth Produces service Tenderness and strength Dreaming on behalf of the other Giving Awareness of own failure – matt 7:5 Calling forth glory and calling out depravity Forgiveness, heap burning coals, turn the other cheek, defraud power	Ambivalence Failure of love Refusal to remember or be connected to your desire Unwillingness to allow life to continue to grow in you and suffer to give birth Do not have a heart of celebration or gratitude Unwilling to mourn because of idolatry	 Widow – envy When we are failed by love we are widowed We have seen our desire met and are now left without this love We are left to our own need for pleasure which kills true desire for momentary pleasure Leads to addictions but the addiction is killing us and giving short bursts of the pleasure we seek – ambivalence It will cost you your face 	 King Creates boundaries Finds order Orient movement toward what is exposed with prophet and priest Stands defiantly and says "no" A servant of glory Gives a safe context for dreams to come to fruition A king asks you to make the hard decisions
